It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon while the sunlight failed; and the curtain in the Temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

Luke 23: 44-46

Students have asked me why we call it Good Friday when such a terrible thing happened. It's a good question. And the answer as to why we think of it as good is found in the result of that terrible day.

Jesus had come preaching salvation, healing the sick and showing humanity the way to live in love. But the ones who were in power cut him down. They thought they were in control of the situation. But there was a greater power that was in control. A heartbroken Father looked at His son giving his life for humanity. Jesus was the sacrifice that once and for all allowed us to be in communion with God. Did you notice that part about the curtain in the Temple? It was what separated the Holy of Holies, the place where God was separated from the rest of humanity. Now that separation was gone.

Make no mistake, Jesus suffered greatly. The Romans had invented crucifixion as the ultimate method of painful execution. The word excruciating was invented to describe the pain that Jesus went through. But through it all, Jesus knew who was in charge. He knew that his Father would receive him into his loving arms and honor the sacrifice that Jesus made.

It is Good Friday, because if it had never happened, we would be lost to sin and death. All of humanity would live in hopelessness and fear. Every year we think about it again. We feel it again. We think about how horrible a price Jesus paid for us. And we think about the life of joy and purpose and the life eternal that are ours because of what happened that Friday; the GOOD Friday. 

The first week of April we are expecting our Easter Candy orders to be delivered by the Clark Candy Co. This was a fundraiser for preschool to pay its annual insurance premium.

On April 3 the Pre-K classes have been invited to the Elderton Senior Citizen's Center to share some songs and poems with the seniors. Since the senior's area is smaller than at the Towne Hall, this will be an event for preschoolers and teachers only. The AM and PM children will be attending in the morning. #### Life is wild...God is good!

ROAR! The 2019 Vacation Bible School is coming closer! Save the dates June 24-28 and plan to bring children from your family or your neighborhood to learn that God is good! From 9 am to Noon each day, the children (ages 3 – potty-trained – through completed 5<sup>th</sup> grade) will learn that even when life is unfair, or scary, or changes, or is sad...God is good! They will also learn that when life is good...God is good then also! The closing program for friends and family will happen at 6 pm on Friday, June 28.

But, we can't make this happen without you! We currently need the following helpers:

- 1. Station Leader: "Stampede Sports" leader and helper: The leader will organize the equipment and choose the games from the booklet provided (or make up some of his/her own). The leader will explain the games to the children and help to direct the activities. The leader will also work in the Bible point and theme of each day while laughing, talking, and cheering on the children. The helper will fill in on teams if the numbers require it, may show the way through obstacle games, and will help the leader with equipment placement and stowing each day.
- 2. Station Leader: "KidVid Cinema" operator: The operator will run a DVD player/smart TV combination to show a movie to the children in each group. The operator will then engage the children in a conversation that helps them to apply the Bible point and lesson to their lives. The script for the suggested conversation starters is included in a guide book, and the movie is on a prepared DVD. The operator will be responsible for turning lights on and off and operating the provided equipment while in the "cinema" with the children (helpers can be incorporated!).
- 3. Station Leader: "Crewleaders": The crewleaders will help to chaperone the safari groups as they travel from room to room during each day's program. We encourage one adult per crew, and added helpers that have completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade or higher, so that we have at least one leader per five children. Each station has a leader and helper, but crewleaders are encouraged to help at each station so that the whole crew is immersed into the story/craft/game/etc.
- 4. "Donors/Lenders": A list will be coming out with requests for supplies to be donated or borrowed. If you are interested in donating or lending an item on the list, please register that with the Shelocta Church (or by taking the appropriate donation tab from the flyer) and provide the items before June 15.
