"God's Word"

Q. What do the Scriptures principally teach?

A. The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

We should be grateful for the Word of God. Where else do we learn about the God of the Hebrews, God's love revealed in Jesus Christ, and how the Spirit of God lives life through us. The Bible teaches us how to believe in God and what God requires of us. If there are any questions about life, in many cases we can go to the Bible and receive answers to those questions. What God wants us to learn is of utmost importance for us, and must serve His own glory.

The Bible is not a science text book though; it does contain scientific observations ranging from the origin of the universe to the process cycle of water.¹ The Christian faith is what the Bible declares. Is not the Bible a history textbook? It is true that a large part of the Bible comprises historical narratives; and it is true that the Christian faith is anchored upon actual events in history that is recorded for us in the Scriptures.²

When I was nineteen, I received a Bible for Christmas from a mother in the gospel. It turned out to be the best gift I ever received. I have been fascinated with the Bible ever since and have not been bored with it. I have witnessed the Bible change my life by what it teaches. I have witnessed the Bible change the life of others close to me. The Bible is inspired by the Holy Spirit and it is the Spirit that will reveal God's word to you. The Bible is my rule for faith and obedience. I find that the older I get the more I need the scriptures for my daily walk with Christ.

Read your Bible when moments present themselves. It will bless your life and give you peace.






