"To Him Be the Glory"

Hello Elderton Presbyterian Church. Well, we are off into another year. February brings a bitter cold along with its wintery mix. It is also one of the darkest months of the year. From time to time it has been my habit to devotionally look at the different Catechism's available to the Presbyterian Church (USA). I thought that for the next couple of months you would like to take a journey with me through the Larger Westminster Catechism. Maybe we could take one or two of the questions and reflect on it for the month. Let's begin with the first question found in the Larger Westminster Catechism.

WLC 1. What is the chief and highest end of man?

A. Man's chief and highest end is to glorify God, and fully to enjoy Him forever.

We may think of many reasons why we exist. Some may think they exist to acquire wealth and power. Some may think the human race does not exist for any purpose outside of itself. Some wrongfully conclude that there is no real purpose in life, for they exist only by chance (life evolved by chance, they say). Others, thinking more narrowly, conclude they exist for the good of society, for the continuance of their family name, etc. (Lim 2017).

Yet, the answer to the question has nothing to do with the aforementioned. The word "end" in the question means the purpose for which something exists. Our catechism states that the end of humanity is to glorify God and enjoy him forever. The word of God clearly states ³⁶ For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. Amen. We find fulfillment and meaning in this life through a conscious effort of glorifying God.

Our aim in life is to live our lives pleasing God in all we do and say. To be a good Christian husband is to glorify God. To be a good Christian wife is to glorify God. To love your neighbor as yourself is to glorify God. One who is consciously seeking to glorify God will also enjoy God and find God to be his chief happiness both in this life and in the life to come.¹ We must use our lives to bring honor to God in all we do. This is what pleases God.

I want to thank all the women for the time and talents they provide and the congregation for the support they provide to Presbyterian Women and all of their projects.


