

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

Matthew 6:21

When I was a boy, I didn't know what Lent was. I thought it was the stuff that came from your belly button. My Roman Catholic friends made a big deal about what they were going to give up for Lent. Trying to fit in, I would say that I was giving up brussels sprouts (not a sacrifice for me.)

Lots of people try to get into the spirit of Lent, (The 40 days from Ash Wednesday until Easter not counting Sundays) It can be a useful time of reflection and repentance in preparation for Easter. Traditionally, people give up something pleasurable like chocolate or donuts or TV. That may help some prepare. I always had a hard time equating chocolate and crucifixion. Any simple pleasure seemed to pale in comparison with the sacrifice that the Lord made on our behalf. He gave up everything. And his sacrifice accomplished something; our salvation.

So I would like to suggest a three pronged approach for this season of Lent.

First, give up something significant. Make it something that can get in your way of connecting with God. Maybe for you it will be gossip or impatience or anger or selfishness. It will be different for everyone.

Second, add something for Lent. This should be something that will enhance your relationship with the one who climbed the hill of skulls to save you. It might be something like adjusting your schedule to spend more time with family. It might be going out of your way to help someone who cannot ever repay you. It may be serious Bible study or volunteering at church or random acts of kindness. Again, it will be different for each person. These are not acts to get us into heaven. Jesus already punched our ticket. These are responses that draw us closer to the the who saved us.

And **finally,** practice listening prayer. Most of my prayer time is me talking to God. I want to learn how to turn off the comfort of noise and silence the busy chatter of my mind and learn how to listen to what God wants to say to me.

However you do it, have a thoughtful, prayerful intentional season of Lent. Then Easter will shine all the brighter.




