PASTOR'S PAGE

His name was David. Not many people knew that was his name. Everybody called him Sugar Bear. He had an unusually large and squared head that resembles a cartoon character. David was the most tormented person I have ever known. The bullies took great sport in mocking him and shoving him. They never took the time to learn his name. He was a convenient target to 7th graders who were asserting their new-found masculinity and superiority.

They would push tables together in the cafeteria tripping him and making him late for his next class. They would knock his books out of his hands. Sometimes they would upset his lunch tray. Once they threw his books out the window from the third floor. He tried to fight back but he was meek and not as big as the bullies. When he took a swing at one of them, they hit him multiple times and he wet his pants and started to cry. Just then the teacher came in and sent him to the office where he was sent home. I never saw David again.

Why do I tell you this story? I was never one who picked on him. I called him David once and he smiled as if someone had finally noticed that he was real. But even after 50 years thinking about David fills me with shame. Because along with all of the decent kids, I never once stood up for him, I never confronted the bullies. I guess was afraid that they would come after me. So what do I do with that kind of shame from long ago? I can't find him to apologize. And even if I could, what would that mean to him? He might well ask, "Where were you when I needed a friend?"

The best I can do is to confess my weakness to God who has already forgiven my weakness. That is what we call grace. It is the forgiveness and favor of God when we do not deserve it. I can also learn a lesson about the down-trodden and the outcast. We may think that bullies are just school children, but that is not so. There are still bullies who pick on the weak with name calling and harassment. I will not do that. I will (and since have) stood up to bullies who were not threatening me. I can learn that grace is not just what God pours out on our failures. It is also the way God expects us to behave towards others; even if grace puts us in harm's way.

Maybe you have someone like David in your past. Maybe you carry around the scars of not helping. I still pray that David grew up healthy and well in spite of the hell he went through. Maybe it is time now to stand up to any bully who tries to take advantage of the vulnerable. That's how grace works. That's how God works. God redeems our failures in our past and helps us understand the pattern that God in Christ wants us to live.


