### Butterfly Hill Preschool

It is already November! Two full months of preschool have been completed and everyone has settled in. The children are having a great time learning many different things.

November brings Thanksgiving activities. The children's favorite topics are Pilgrims, Indians and Turkey's! The children will learn about being thankful for what they have. They will also participate in the "Thankful Food Bank Collection" for our Food Bank here at the church. The Pre-K children will enjoy a full Thanksgiving Feast on November 25 and the 3 year old Caterpillars will enjoy a teacher provided snack on November 26....a mini-cornucopia filled with fresh fruit.

November units for the Pre-K & Caterpillar students are Thanksgiving, Letters, Colors & Shapes with the monthly concept of Numbers. Letter Week's for the Pre-K students in November will be the letters H, U, O & Q. The Toddlers will be learning about Farm Animals, Farm Vegetables, Turkey's, Thanksgiving and Numbers 1 to 10. Prayer time is also part of our day, we start the day with prayer taking requests from the children. A Pre-K visit is planned to the Senior Center for a time of games & interaction with the seniors!

On November 25 the children of both morning and afternoon classes will be attending in the morning, while the parents are invited to a Kindergarten Transition Meeting in the sanctuary. Teachers from the elementary school will be here to go over information for children going to Kindergarten next fall; they will answer questions and have valuable handouts for the parents.

Preschool is having their annual fundraiser of Christmas wreaths, grave pillows and new this year, window sill boughs. Sale deadline is November 15. An order form is in this November newsletter and will be available in church bulletins the first two Sunday's in November. These are locally made and are beautiful.

The Annual Angel Tree info is included in this newsletter also. As soon as preschool gets names from CYS of Armstrong County, angels will be made and hung on the tree in the Upper Room. Dates that this program runs are around November 24 through December 10.

A heartfelt thank you to everyone who supported the Samaritan's Purse Program. We are sad to see that this year is the last year for "Friends of Samaritan's Purse". Our preschool families and our staff at preschool were all supportive of the "Shoe Box" venture. We are so glad to be a part of this Great Mission Project!
