"Peace Be with You" John 20: 19-23

19 On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." 20 When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. 21 Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." 22 And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. 23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

There is no day more important to God's faithful people than Easter. Easter celebrates the risen Lord and our assurance of eternal life. However, when the Resurrection took place, it was not a celebration for the disciples.

The disciples were scattered for fear of the Jews who wanted to obliterate anything or anyone connected to Jesus. So, after the crucifixion, the disciples were considered subversive to the power of Jews of that time. Which brings us to our passage. All of the disciples for the exception of Thomas were together.

Whenever we are in a chaotic or stressful state, our minds search for order: to make sense of things, to understand the world, to organize the data that comes in the moment. This is the state of mind of the disciples after Jesus' death. As we can see, the disciples were behind closed doors and afraid. They were trying to make sense of what was going on. Our passage says, Jesus came and stood among them.

We sometimes find ourselves in moments where the world does not make sense, our minds search for order, and soul attempts to survive the chaos around us. Faced with such moments, we often close ourselves off from the ones we love or become distant. During these times we can become just like the disciples in fear and locked behind closed doors.

Jesus Christ steps in our midst and speaks peace. Jesus promised this peace to the disciples earlier in the gospel of John 14:27 - Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid. Little did they know that they would need that peace from Jesus during such a tumultuous time in their lives.

We often need to hear the words of Jesus, "Peace be unto you." Easter brings the promise of peace in our lives. Be at peace beloved during this Easter season.
