## THE COST OF FOLLOWING JESUS LUKE 9:57-62

<sup>57</sup> As they were going along the road, someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go." <sup>58</sup> And Jesus said to him, "Foxes have holes, and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head." <sup>59</sup> To another he said, "Follow me." But he said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." <sup>60</sup> And Jesus said to him, "Leave the dead to bury their own dead. But as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." <sup>61</sup> Yet another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but let me first say farewell to those at my home." <sup>62</sup> Jesus said to him, "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

There are causes that lead to commitment issues. Many events that happen in a person's life can lead to one having commitment issues. You will find people with commitment problems getting panicky or dismissive when you talk about future plans. People who have commitment issues are most likely not to be emotionally attached. People who have commitment issues avoid making plans. People who have issues with commitment have a fear of long-term relationships.

Any person who would follow Jesus must understand it requires total commitment. It is a rejection of the world and all that it has to offer, if that what it means. Discipleship is not a fly by night affair. Discipleship requires that Jesus and the kingdom by the priority of life. To follow Jesus means more than just singing hymns. It is a reorientation of life, involving suffering and rejection. The Christian is to make a daily obligation to discipleship.

1. To Be a Disciple Calls for a Reorientation of Life. Faith can be expressed and experienced in a variety of ways, but there comes a time each one's journey when it is necessary clearly and unequivocally to declare the depth of that commitment. God is to have a priority in our lives that is going to interfere with our convenience. Unlike other things we commit ourselves to, God comes first. With single-minded devotion and wholehearted courage, we must purse what lies ahead, never turning aside, and never looking back

**2. To Be a Disciple Takes Resolve.** But the man said, "Lord, let me first go and bury my father." And Jesus said to him, "Leave the dead to bury their own dead. But as for you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." Following Jesus is what it is all about. We are to follow Jesus when we feel like it and when we don't feel like it. It requires unresolved wavering to follow Jesus.

**3.** To Be a Disciple Takes an Absolute Commitment. A commitment to Jesus is exclusive. A commitment to Jesus demands a total break from the past. Your past cannot have the power over you if you are going to follow Jesus. Discipleship means entering into a lifelong relationship with Jesus.

Any person who would follow Jesus must understand it will require total commitment. We must reject the world and all that it has to offer. This is what it means to be a disciple.
