WISDOM FOR A MERRY CHRISTMAS

Matthew 2:1-12

The story of the magi begins with a brief historical reference to the time of Jesus' birth. Matthew dates this event in the time of King Herod. King Herod was acclaimed by some for his massive building projects, he was at the same time feared and despised for his ruthless treatment of rivals and opponents. Herod's reputation was as a vicious politician anxious about his status as king.

While Herod is king, Matthew tells us that there is a delegation of wise men. We are told these are astrologers from the East. They may have been from Arabia or Babylonia. The Magi are considered Gentiles. The Magi represent the spiritual elite of the Gentile world, those who have taken wisdom as far as it can go.

Even though they were considered wise they still sought the maker of all wisdom, the king of the Jews. The shining star leading to the King of Kings was bright upon the savior of the world.

Wisdom defined by Oxford Dictionary is the body of knowledge and experience that develops within a specified society or period. We can also say it is having or showing experience, knowledge, and good judgment.

The Bible refers to wisdom quite a bit. My favorite is Proverbs 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, but fools despise wisdom and discipline. The Magi were men who understood the worship of deities in their own land. They also knew of the Jewish God of the Hebrews. I always wondered if the Magi's visit to see Jesus affected their belief system.

The first time I went to church I was not seeking God at all. I definitely was not seeking wisdom. Even though God change my life and gave me some wisdom over the years, I was not seeking out the King of Kings. The Magi on the other hand was seeking the King of the Jews and for all intents and purposes worshipped him.

I deeply believe the Magi were changed and their belief system reflected it based on their travel to see Jesus and their worship of Jesus. Seeking God is the beginning of wisdom. When you seek God and find him, life is not the same. Life begins when God reveals himself to you. Life is never the same after God reveals himself.

We have seen the Savior and we are not the same. We have experienced the Word of God and live a new life. We worship the Lord Jesus Christ and have received the wisdom that is the most important. Proverbs 1:7 The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, but fools despise wisdom and discipline.



CHRISTMAS ANGEL TREE


through Children & Youth Services of Armstrong County
