## Image Bearer Genesis 9:6

<sup>6</sup> "Whoever sheds the blood of man, by man shall his blood be shed, for God made man in his own image.

God has come to a point in his journey with humanity that we should ponder for the upcoming year. God has made humanity in his own image and likeness. Our text illustrates how important it is to God that humanity is in his image. God has reproduced himself in us and we are to give him glory and enjoy him forever.


