# "The Beginning of Wisdom" Psalm 111

We human creatures seem to be born to wonder, to love, and to praise. We are born for other things as well, of course. We work, we speak, we create, and we make and keep covenants together. All these things are found in the human communities we know about, and they take a central place in our lives as well. But wonder, love, and praise seem different somehow. They are expressions of our deepest being and deepest longing. No matter what happens to us or what we achieve, they point us to something greater, something better that surrounds our lives and makes us glad. The last lines of our psalm couple together the praise of the Lord with a life of developed wisdom and understanding.

Thankfulness is The Door of Life to Mature Spiritual Wisdom.

The eternal God, the Source of all, does not need our praise, to gain a healthy spiritual self-understanding, we need to remember that our lives are set in the midst of an unimaginable greatness and goodness. We must take moments in our lives to praise God and then continue to thank him for what he has done and who he is. Verse two and three speak to the praise of God... <sup>2</sup> Great are the works of the LORD, studied by all who delight in them. <sup>3</sup> Full of splendor and majesty is his work, and his righteousness endures forever.....It really is all about cultivating a sense of the presence of God. Thankfulness is The Door of Life to Mature Spiritual Wisdom.

Corporate Worship Teaches Thankfulness.

Our text reads... <sup>6</sup> He has shown his people the power of his works, in giving them the inheritance of the nations.<sup>7</sup> The works of his hands are faithful and just; all his precepts are trustworthy; <sup>8</sup> they are established forever and ever, to be performed with faithfulness and uprightness..... When we sing a hymn together or when we sing with the choir, we are learning worship. We are participating with the heavenly host of God in praising God. We are being trained for the purpose of loving God throughout the challenges of the week. Sunday worship fortifies you for the rough patches that will come during the days of life. Worshipping God together means letting our lives be shaped by taking God's praise to heart. We give praise and become the praise of God at the same time. Corporate Worship Teaches Thankfulness.

Whoever Fears God is Blessed.

Knowing God, loving God, and serving God brings about a blessed life. Verse ten reads.... <sup>10</sup>The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom; all those who practice it have a good understanding. His praise endures forever!.... The psalm is telling us that the first step is to have a proper attitude toward the holy and awesome God. Look at your life and ask what would my life be without the Lord? What kind of substance would my life have if it had not been for Jesus Christ? God imparts understanding to us on the journey of life. He continues to show that my life would be terrible if the Lord had not saved me.

Wherever people acknowledge and believe in God, there is a fear of God. The wisdom of God is more beautiful and valuable than anything we have ever seen or can imagine. Reverential fear is the main distinguishing mark of our respect for God, and it has its beginning in divine wisdom.

### What is Per Capita?

Presbyterians share equally, responsibilty, and interdependently in the costs of governing the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), no matter the size of their congregations.

Our church is responsible for paying a per capita amount of \$37.40 per member, this money is taken from the yearly budget.

The \$37.40 per member is divided and paid to the following:

\$25.00 - Kiskiminetas Presbytery, \$2.40 - the Synod of the Trinity, \$10.00 - General Assembly

In order to maintain our projected budget, the session is asking that each member of the church pays for their per capita by placing \$37.40 in the yellow initail offering enevelopeand placing it in then offering plate
