#### Love One Another John 13:31-35

John presents Jesus as the true Passover Lamb, crucified for us, just as lambs are slaughtered on the day of preparation before the Passover. Jesus shows his love most completely by sacrificing himself for the sins of the world. The sacrifice is fulfilled in this once-and-for-all self-giving of God. Jesus is setting his face to the cross and speaking in glowing terms of the glorification of God. Jesus Christ loves his disciples and has displayed that kind of love the entire time with them. This represents Jesus' farewell to his disciples. If there was anything people saw during the life of Jesus, it was the love he had for the disciples and for others. Jesus leaves sound instruction as to what is the main characteristic of a Christian Church.

Love is to be the badge that the Christian community wears before the watching world. As we read verse 35, we are bound to cringe with shame at the way in which professing Christians have treated each other down the years. We have sometimes turned the gospel into a weapon and have hit each other over the head with it. The Church has been difficult on one another instead of loving one another. There have been moments Jesus has chastised the disciples for not loving each other.

Jesus encourages us to love one another. Jesus epitomized the idea of love through his service to the disciples. Remember how he put on a towel and washed the disciple's feet? Certainly, his love was evident when he instituted to the sacrament of communion. Jesus makes it plain that loving is serving and if Jesus has served them then they can serve one another. God's glory is revealed in Jesus' love. Jesus' mission is to glorify God and to glorify God is to reveal God. It is through Jesus's manifestation of divine self-giving love that God is revealed. The ultimate manifestation of Jesus' love is his death on the cross. What John, however, may be identifying as "new" is that their love for one another should be reflective of God's divine self-giving love as manifested in Jesus. As Jesus loved and served them, so they should love and serve one another.

To observe a Church love above the petty little things which could bog a church down is a wonder. There is going to come a time when all you have is the church. Being a part of a church where love is the core is a blessing. We have been destined in love through Jesus Christ.

The early Latin writer, Tertullian of Carthage, declared that the one thing that converted him to Christianity was not the arguments they gave him, because he could find a counterpoint for every argument they would present. "But they demonstrated something I didn't have. The thing that converted me to Christianity was the way they loved each other." 1
