# "PSALM 51 FOR THE BELIEVER"

Psalm 51 is a Psalm we are all familiar with, but it resonates with deeper meaning when we are in the season of Lent. Some of the words are soaring as well as weighty. We can hear David's heart as he asks forgiveness of the Lord. We can also hear the anguish in David's voice when he uses words like "transgressions, iniquity, and sin".

We hear the hope in David's voice when he uses words like "joy, create, and restore". This hope is steeped in the character of a loving and merciful God full of compassion.

We are familiar with David's words not only because we have read them, but we have experienced them. We have found ourselves in places where sin has overwhelmed our lives. Sin and its power are something the believer constantly fights against. And there are times more than others when it is more of a fight than normal.

There are some Christian theologies that promote a sinless life. This is radically against scripture and leads to self-righteousness.

1 John 1:8-10

<sup>8</sup> If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. <sup>9</sup> If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. <sup>10</sup> If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

We need not lie to ourselves about the sin in our lives. We must confront sin and confess it to Christ our Savior. Once forgiven we can live in the blessed life of Christ.

Romans 4:8 reads.

8 blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

During this Lenten season let us hold fast to Psalm 51 as a daily reminder of Christ's forgiveness of our sin and he ready presence to give grace.
