"Nothing But the Blood" Ephesians 1:7-10

⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, ⁸ which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight ⁹ making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ ¹⁰ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth.

There seems to be a lack of love for humanity. It appears as though society does not care for itself the way it should as we are faced with a generation that does not love itself. Think about it for a moment. The way people desire to just kill others because life appears unfair to them. The way countries start wars on smaller countries. The way people do not care for the poor and the broken. These actions make it seem that there is a lack of love for humanity. Christians do not fall into this category because they understand what it means to be love and what it means to love because they have been loved by Jesus Christ. We are a redeemed people and have been bought by a sacrifice.

Redemption is more than an event or an item; rather, it rests in a person, it rests on a Redeemer. No redeemer, no redemption. That person, that Redeemer, is none other than Jesus Christ. Why is a redeemer necessary?

Our Spiritual State is Dead in Trespasses and Sin.

We were enslaved to sin, and owned by Satan. Our lives were wrapped up in the brokenness which sin desires. God has redeemed us from the curse of the Law and we have been released from the bondage of sin. We have been set free from the power of iniquity. We have been set free from the results of sin. We are a free people in the name of Jesus Christ. Redemption is Jesus buying us back through his blood. Jesus paid the ultimate price for our redemption.

We Have Been Redeemed Through His Blood.

Hear what is said in, Psalm 49:15 ¹⁵ But God will ransom my soul from the power of Sheol, for he will receive me. Sin must not be taken lightly, for it requires a blood sacrifice. God acts as redeemer by powerfully delivering us from sin. Because of this redemption we are adopted into the beloved of God. We have sonship not from our own worthiness, but because of Jesus' blood sacrifice. We who are united with God hold on to Jesus Christ. We have been redeemed through the counsel of God. Professor Klueker says it this way: The entire Pauline theology rests mainly on what he calls the *Divine mystery*, terming its execution the *economy* of God. No Apostle speaks with such a sweep and fulness of spirit, as Paul, whose revelation is in this economy.

A few years ago, a very small girl in Texas fell down the shaft of an abandoned well. She landed on a small shelf many feet down. Had she fallen a few inches to one side, she would have plunged into the bowels of the earth. A microphone was lowered down in an attempt to determine her condition. At one point she could be heard reciting nursery rhymes. Skilled and concerned people labored hard and long to rescue her. A tunnel had to be dug down and then angled to her location. The nation cheered as they finally saw a man come out of the tunnel with the little girl in his arms. She had been redeemed from a pit. Because of the sin of Adam and Eve we have been pulled down into sin and brokenness. Because of Jesus Christ we have been redeemed from the pit.



HAWAII WILDFIRES PRESBYTERIAN DISATSER ASSISTANCE
